Warren Lockwood will highlight the lives of the Atfalati band of the Kalapuya tribe. Through pictures, stories and discussion, he will showcase some of the resourceful and early technologies that the Atfalati developed from stone, bone, and local plants. Utilizing a kit of artifacts from the museum's collection, Lockwood will demonstrate the purpose of specific objects and explain them in the context of the lives of the people who used them.
