Scout Saturdays bring local history to life. Choose from three informative, educational and entertaining presentations created especially for Daisy, Brownie and Junior Scouts. Scouts satisfy specific badge requirements and receive a Washington County Museum specialty badge.



Scout Saturdays are held on the first and third Saturdays of every month. The programs are one hour in length and a troop leader or parent is required to be present.

*Using the Museum's exhibits and artifacts, the presenter demonstrates how Native Americans and settlers used the items in their daily lives.*

## Daisy Scouts

Daisy Scouts will have the opportunity to learn about their local history through hands-on activities such as craft making. Daisies will complete an "Alphabet Hike" through the museum's current exhibit, learn about local Native Americans and pioneer girls, and play a game to discover the purpose of museum artifacts. *Daisy Scouts will receive their Washington County Museum specialty badge.*



## Brownie Scouts

Brownie Scouts will learn about Washington County's history through pictures, games, hands-on activities and stories. Brownies will play Native American games and act out stories from the past. They will also learn about historic buildings in the community that are still standing today. *Brownie Scouts will complete their Listening to the Past Try-It*



## Junior Scouts

Junior Scouts will learn what life was like for the first inhabitants of Washington County through hands-on activities, craft making and storytelling. Juniors use maps, photographs and historic documents to examine how the area has changed and discover hidden secrets and stories of the county's history. Each troop will also participate in a preservation project for the museum. *Junior Girl Scouts will earn their Local Lore Badge.*
