## **Biographical Note**

---

Collection of 26 boxes of the assorted writings and resources of Albert Tozier. Tozier was a local newspaper editor and a local historian, and his collection served as the nucleus for the Washington County Museum.

Tozier was born to Charles and Zerilda Tozier on March 7, 1860 in Nebraska. The family traveled over the Oregon Trail in 1863, and settled near Hillsboro. Albert attended Tualatin Academy in Forest Grove, and graduated in 1881.

Tozier was the editor and part owner of the Hillsboro Independent newspaper from 1885-1887, and he also helped found the National Editorial Association. Throughout his career, he and his sister Edith remained devoted to collecting and preserving Oregon history, included their tenure as the guardians of the Champoeg State Park's collection.

Tozier died on June 27, 1937 and is buried at Hillsboro Pioneer Cemetery.
